

Laura Pulido to discuss influence of politics, racism on climate change

Pulido, Collins Chair and professor of Indigenous, race, and ethnic studies and geography at the University of Oregon, is the featured speaker for the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences' 2024 EMS Reads program.

Pulido's talk is a follow-up to last spring's EMS Reads, which focused on Heather McGhee's book, "The Sum of Us: What Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together."

Pulido will talk about race and sustainability, helping us to better understand the costs of racism to climate and how white nationalism has become linked to climate obstruction.
